



Maryland Solar Access Program FY25 Authorization Form Guideline

The Maryland Solar Access Program¹ ("MSAP", the "Program") was established by the Maryland General Assembly's passage of the Brighter Tomorrow Act (Chapter 595, 2024 Acts of Maryland, hereafter "the Act")², to help provide Marylanders with more equitable access to solar PV technology. The Act allows for a direct resident application or a third-party application. The options allow the Maryland resident (applicant) to receive the grant directly or reassign payment of the grant to their solar PV installation contractor.

The applicant or their authorized third-party agent applies with all required supporting documents defined in the "Required Application Documents" section of the <u>Funding Opportunity Announcement</u>, to reserve grant funds for the solar PV system that will be paid out after it is installed. Each applicant must create an account on the <u>MSAP Online Application Portal</u> before an application for a Reservation Certificate can be submitted.

The Completion Certificate must be submitted under the same account after the system is installed. For the reassignment of an application or award A <u>MSAP Third-Party Authorization Form</u> is signed by both the third party and the solar PV customer.
