Program Description: Available to nonprofit organizations and local governments, the Maryland Energy Administration's (MEA) Low-to-Moderate Income Energy Efficiency Grant Program is designed to support energy efficiency projects and activities benefiting low-to-moderate income (LMI) Marylanders. Grants are awarded for energy efficiency projects that generate

significant reductions in energy use and pass on the benefits of the savings to Maryland's LMI residents.

The LMI program first allocates funding regionally based on the number of LMI households located within the respective region to ensure an equitable distribution of grant funds. Grants are then competitively awarded within the applicant pool for each region.

Type of Program: Competitive Grant Program

Application Deadline: Thursday, December 1, 2022 by 11:59 P.M. EST

Anticipated Program Budget: \$16.5M total program budget anticipated for FY23, to be allocated regionally across Maryland.
